The Wright Stuff...

Bill Wright, the Australian BBB Fund Administrator reports the news from Australia:

"I have been at Conflux, the 43rd Australian National SF Convention at Canberra over April 23-26, 2004. Apart from the Art Show and a brilliant Masquerade party, it was almost exclusively a litcon. The quality of the panelists and the proportion of authors and budding authors in the audience were very high. Most attendees learned a lot, myself included.

"The auction of memorabilia directly for the BBB Fund raised AUS\$125. Administrators of the other fan funds, DUFF, FFANZ, GUFF and NAFF, allocated AUS\$50 of their takings to the BBB Fund. One fan bought a fanzine at auction for \$40, then immediately returned the item for re-auction. The resubmitted item raised an additional AUS\$15. One fan donated AUS\$20 of his auction proceeds to our fund. There were also three direct donations totaling AUS\$170. That makes the amount raised at Conflux AUS\$404, which is equivalent to US\$303. That makes the total raised in Australia so far AUS\$619 (US \$464).

"Although he wasn't present, Bruce Gillespie's profile at Conflux was high. Greg Benford mentioned him in his GoH speech. Bruce also won a Ditmar (Australian SF Achievement) Award - for Best Fan Writer, and the William Atheling Jr. Award.

"Bruce Gillespie is on track towards posting his entire fanzine production for the last 15 years, including his apazines, on efanzines.com by April 30, 2004. His Scratch Pad files now contain nearly 300,000 words and he still has a way to go.

"Irwin Hirsh and Bruce are collaborating on *I* Must Be Talking to my Friends: The Best of Bruce Gillespie. We'll have details on the contents fairly soon." — Bill Wright.
