On Sunday, I saw <u>James Daughtery</u> sitting behind a San Francisco Fandom table. After we shook hands, Jim said that "many of us want to see things happen in Las Vegas." James is listed as the bid chair for the Westercon '08 in Las Vegas bid, wife <u>Katheryn</u>, <u>Christian McGuire</u> and <u>Elayne Pelz</u> also listed on the bid committee.

This was a little to the annoyance of my roommates, who were trying to plan a party and thought these were early arrivals.
