ways great to see Bill. Joyce and I have celebrated so many New Years with him that it wouldn't seem like a normal year-ender without him.


Alan and DeDee White pepped up the evening considerable when they breezed into the Launch Pad. Alan had his camera going al-

In some way that I still don't entirely understand, I am responsible for Woody getting off his butt and publishing his first fanzine in years. He apparently bridled at my comparison of him to Peggy Burke, a local under-achiever, and resolved to make me eat my words.

This easy-going one man show is longer on charm, amply supplied by its lovable, bumbling editor, and irritatingly short on technique and polish.

This fanzine could end up fooling a lot of people. It may be much closer to being a solid fanzine than it appears. Woody rushed this issue unnecessarily, which contributed to some glaring layout flaws and typo-ridden copy. Woody also needs to continue to move away from old topics and concerns and focus more on recounting his life and attitudes in the hear and now.

Yet *The Gay Blade* has something you can't learn or counterfeit: the spirit of Trufandom. If Woody shakes off the rust by publishing again soon and takes the production side of things more seriously, this could turn into an enjoyable fanzine.

Vegas fans who are new to the field could do a lot worse than support Woody's efforts with letters of comment and writtencontributions.

VSFA 1/3 Meeting Report

It looks like the heavy activity on the VSFA listserv is starting to translate into stepped up meeting activity. Twice as many fans attended the January meeting as the December one. Here's <u>Woody</u> <u>Bernardi</u>'s report:

Monday's VSFA meeting was attended by Kent Hastings, Woody Bernardi, Joshua Andrews, Terry Wilsey, Teresa Cochran and Robert Pinneo (a new attendee).

We discussed the registration of VSFA officers with the State of Nevada. We are registered with the state as a Nevada Nonprofit Corp but we still need to register 2 or more officers before we can open a bank account. Since we do have a check from the Plaza Hotel made out to VSFA it would be good to be able to open a bank acct so we can have access to the funds. There is a \$50 fee to register officers with the state.

We also looked at submitting the paperwork for federal nonprofit status and will do so. Another subject was the Readers of the Future program. There is an active chapter in Utah. They provide books to poor rural school libraries. We agreed that this is a worthwhile project for VSFA. We have several librarians in Las Vegas Fandom. I also know two educators at the Clark County School District who are interested in SF as an art form. Also there is the English Professor at UNLV who has taught SF in the classroom. It is my hope that we can get some of these education professionals interested in this as a VSFA project.

Kent showed off his copy of the coffee table edition of "The Worlds of Tomorrow". This is full of glossy photos of pulp era book and magazine covers and is a companion to the movie "Sky Captain and the Worlds of Tomorrow".

We adjourned to Blueberry Hill where four of us enjoyed a late supper and more socializing. For those who haven't attended VSFA, the meeting blends formal and informal segments. Our meetings never last more than 1 hour and 15 min, but our after-meetings generally go two hours or more. — Woody Bernardi.
