DESCRIPTION

The Electro-Voice N/D50 is a dynamic cardioid microphone using the revolutionary neodymium alloy to form the N/DYM® magnet. This magnet, a rare-earth supermagnet, has four times the power of conventional magnets. The N/DYM® magnetic structure boosts output by channeling the magnet's power directly to the voice coil gap and the more uniform magnetic field lowers distortion during peak sound pressure levels.

The N/D50 also features a revolutionary vibration-isolation suspension system employing EV's new dynamic damping material — DynaDamp™. DynaDamp™ is a low-Q elastomeric polymer with extremely high energy absorbing properties. The result is a substantial reduction in handling and cable transmission noise.

The N/D50 has an extended high-frequency response with an open, transparent sound quality due to a large diaphragm that contains 50 percent more surface area than conventional designs and is reinforced to prevent breakup. The N/D50 design also provides the up-close bass boost (proximity effect) preferred by many entertainers.

The N/D50 features a rugged die-cast zinc case, a Memraflex grille screen that retains its shape for years of "on-the-road" use and an on/off switch that locks in the "on" position if desired. The dynamic element will provide years of reliable operation, even in humidity and temperature extremes, and with its exceptional sensitivity combined with its inherent low noise, ensures a superior signal-to-noise ratio ready for digital recording and sampling. An Acoustifoam™ pop-filter, with specially molded retainers, offer maximum rejection of both wind noise and "P-pop"

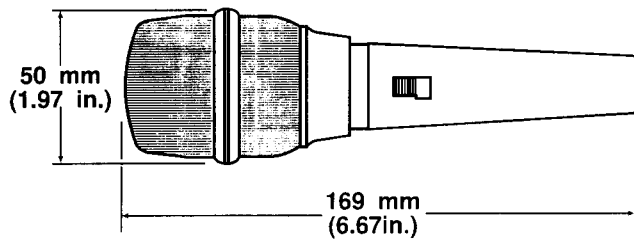
breath sounds. A uniform cardioid polar pattern ensures superior gain-before-feedback in live applications. The polar pattern also provides better isolation in the studio — at all frequencies — compared with other directional microphones with widely varying polar characteristics.

USING THE VARIABLE FREQUENCY RESPONSE (PROXIMITY EFFECT)

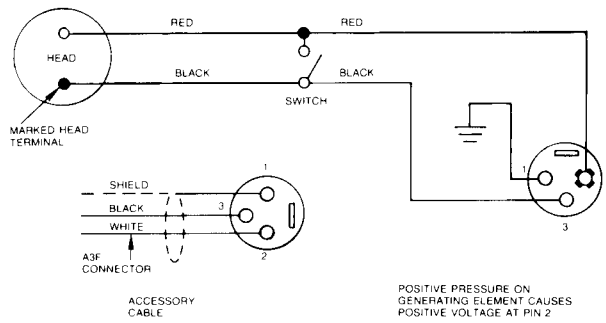
The N/D50's low-frequency response extends by positioning the microphone closer to the sound source as shown in Figure 3. This proximity effect occurs when the microphone is within 12 inches of the sound source. The effect increases as the working distance decreases.

Imaginative application of the N/D50's proximity effect creates useful special effects:

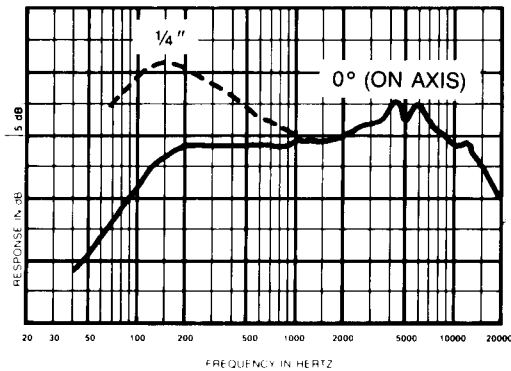
1. By working closer to the microphone, the human voice will sound more robust.
2. Working close to the N/D50 reduces the occurrence of PA system feedback better than using the cardioid directional characteristics alone. When close-talked, the substantial bass boost provides an increase in overall microphone output level. The mixer gain may be proportionately reduced, resulting in a reduction of the system's sensitivity to feedback caused by sound entering the microphone from the distant loudspeakers.
3. For musical instrument pickup, use the variable bass response to achieve a clean bass pickup at a distance of 12 inches or more. By moving the N/D50 a few inches from the instrument, the bass will increase.



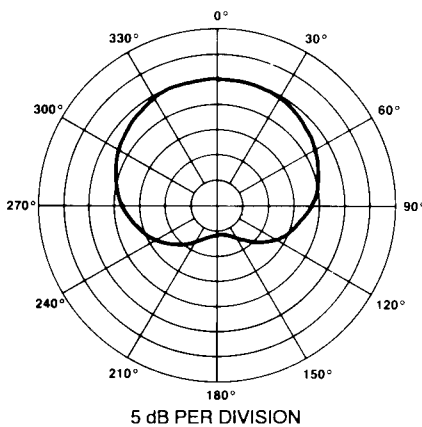
**FIGURE 1 —
Dimensions**



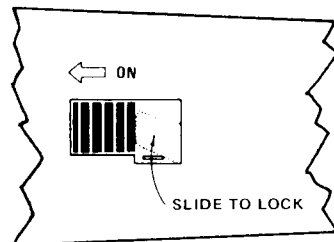
**FIGURE 2 —

LOCKABLE ON/OFF SWITCH

Figure 5 shows the N/D50's lockable on/off switch assembly. To lock the switch in the "on" position, slide the metal locking tab into the position shown. A small screwdriver is ideal for this purpose.
