- Q: "How many receivers can be used with one transmitter?" A: The SoundMate system operates just like a small FM radio station, so there is no limit to the number of receivers which can be used with one transmitter.
- Q: "What kind of places need Assistive Listening?"

  A: All public spaces with fixed seating for more than 50 people must provide some form of Assitive Listening according to the American Disability Act (ADA) of 1992. That includes schools, theaters, and auditoriums. Churches are not considered public spaces, but many offer Assistive Listening for the comfort of their members with hearing loss.
