# **Precautions**

#### Operation

- Should any solid object or liquid fall into the cabinet, unplug the unit and have it checked by qualified personnel before operating it any further.
- Avoid rough handling or mechanical shock to the unit.

- Do not wrap up the unit and operate it because heat may build up internally.
- Avoid using and storing the unit in the following locations:
  - -susceptible to vibration
- -exposed to strong magnetic fields

- -near TV or radio transmitters where strong radio waves are generated
- -on the sand
- -near heat sources such as radiators or air ducts
- -subject to direct sunlight or excessive dust
- Do not leave the unit in a car or in a trunk.

#### Care

• Clean the unit body with a dry, soft cloth, or a soft cloth lightly moistened with a mild detergent solution. Do not use any type of solvent which may damage the finish.

#### Maintenance

- The built-in clock of the unit may not work correctly due to temperature change, etc.
  - Check the clock occasionally and set the time again if necessary.
- About one year of normal operation can be expected with the supplied lithium battery. We recommend replacing the battery before it is completely run down.
- Take care of the Video Walkman while referring to the operation manual supplied with it.

# Overview of the PGV-250/250P

The PGV-250/250P is an alarm recording adaptor designed to be used with the Video Walkman.

By connecting the Video Walkman and a camera (or another video source) to this adaptor, you can perform program recording, date/time superimposition, and so on.

#### Features

- Time/date superimposition
- Program recording

By program setting, you can perform three types of recording.

#### **ALARM mode:**

Starts recording automatically when an alarm signal is input to this adaptor.

#### **CONTI REC (Continuous Recording) mode:**

keeps recording even if you press □ (stop) or PAUSE ■ on the Video Walkman by mistake.

#### TIMER mode:

starts and stops recording at the time you set and the recording is performed in ALM (alarm) or CREC (Continuous Recording) mode.

- Alarm signal output to show the program recording status (You can set the alarm signal to be output while a program recording is made, or when the tape reaches its end.)
- Back up function to resume the former status after the recovery of a power fallure
- Alarm list to show you the time and cause of each alarm recording with its alarm number
- Automatic repeat function to rewind the tape when the tape reaches its end
- CHECK screen to confirm the settings
- Built-in microphone amplifier


# **Installing a Lithium Battery**

When this adaptor is connected to the Video Walkman and to an AC power source, the power for this adaptor is supplied via the PAD-250 Battery Adaptor. The only other power needed by this adaptor is a lithium battery to power the clock and keep the settings and the alarm list in memory, even when the host power to the Video Walkman is interrupted or this adaptor is disconnected from the Video Walkman.

1 Open the lid of the lithium battery compartment.




2 Install the supplied CR2032 lithium battery with the + side facing out.



Close the lid.

#### To remove the lithium battery

Push the battery forward and remove it as illustrated.



#### Lithium battery life

Approximately one year is expected in normal operation. If the lithium battery becomes weak, "Backup Battery Low" appears on the monitor when the adaptor is in normal screen mode.

In this case, replace the battery with a Sony CR2032 lithium battery. Use of another battery may present a risk of fire or explosion. After replacing the battery, set the clock again.

#### **Caution**

- Keep the lithium battery out of the reach of children. Should the battery be swallowed, consult a doctor immediately.
- Before use, wipe the battery with a dry cloth to assure a good contact.
- Be sure to observe the correct polarity when installing the battery.
- Do not hold the battery with metallic tweezers, as that may cause a short-circuit.
- Do not break up the battery or throw it into a fire because it may explode. Carefully dispose of the used batteries.




# **Connections**

### Attaching this Adaptor to the Video Walkman


Remove the left side cover of the Video Walkman while sliding the RELEASE lever in the direction of the arrow (\_\_\_\_).



2 Align the edge of the flap of this adaptor to the mark on the Video Walkman as illustrated, then slide the adaptor backward until it clicks.



3 Connect the PAD-250 Battery Adaptor (supplied with this adaptor) to the Video Walkman as illustrated, and connect the cable of the PAD-250 to the DC IN 7.2 V jack of this adaptor.




#### Note

If nothing will be connected to the left side of this adaptor, it is recommended to attach the left side cover of the Video Walkman to this adaptor to protect the exposed connecting sections.

#### To remove this adaptor from the Video Walkman

Pull this adaptor forward while sliding the RELEASE lever on the adaptor in the direction of the arrow (——).



#### Note

When this adaptor is not connected to the Video Walkman, be sure to attach the left side cover to the Video Walkman to protect the exposed connecting sections.

# Connecting a Monitor to the Video Walkman

The menu operation can be done on the monitor connected to the Video Walkman.

Be sure to connect an appropriate monitor to the Video Walkman.

Refer to the operating instructions coming with the Video Walkman.


If your Video Walkman is equipped with an LCD monitor, the menu operation can be done on this monitor.

#### Connecting Video Source Equipment


This adaptor accepts video source equipment (such as a video camera) of the following types:

- A video camera having a multi-connector that matches the multi-connector of this adaptor
- A video camera (or other video equipment) with S-video output
- A video camera (or other video equipment) with composite video output

#### Connecting a video camera having a multi-connector




# Connecting video source equipment with S-video output/composite video output



#### **Setting the INPUT SELECT switch**

After connecting video source equipment, set the INPUT SELECT switch on this adaptor to the appropriate position according to the type of the video source connected.




#### Note

If you set the INPUT SELECT switch to MULTI while nothing is connected to the multi-connector, the S-video input will be selected.

# Connecting Audio Source Equipment

You can connect audio output terminals of the video camera to this adaptor.

You can connect, instead of a video camera as an audio source, a micorphone or another audio source equipment.




#### Note

Set the type of the audio source connected to the AUDIO L/R jacks using the OPTIONAL SETUP menu. (See page 22.)

## Connecting Alarm Equipment

You can connect an external alarm sensor (an infrared sensor, a motion detector, etc.) to input alarm signals which are considered as triggers for alarm recordings.

If you want to remotely monitor the recording status, you can connect equipment to receive status signals from this adaptor. Use the OPTIONAL SETUP menu to select the type of the status signal to be used. (See page 22.)



# Setting the Clock and the Clock Display Position

You can set the clock and the clock display position so that the date and time are superimposed on the monitor screen connected to the Video Walkman.


You can select the time indication between 12-hour and 24-hour formats.

Moreover, you can also select the date format from among Month/Day/Year, Day/Month/Year, and Year/Month/Day.

#### Before setting

#### Check the following points:

- Is the lithium battery installed correctly? (See page 8.)
- Is this adaptor connected to the Video Walkman correctly? (See page 10.)
- Is this adaptor connected to the power source correctly? (See page 16.)
- Is the POWER switch on this adaptor set to ON?



### Example: Set to 1:15PM, July 4, 1998

1 Turn on the Vidco Walkman.

The POWER lamp of the Video Walkman lights up. This adaptor turns on simultaneously. (If this is the first time you turn on this adaptor after connecting it to the Video Walkman, the CLOCK SETUP menu appears automatically. Go to step 4.)



The MENU screen appears on the monitor connected to the Video Walkman.

The CLOCK SETUP menu appears.



4 Set the month, day, and year.
Press SEL/PUSH EXECUTE to select the item, roll SEL/PUSH EXECUTE up or down until the desired number appears, and press SEL/PUSH EXECUTE to decide.

The day of the week is automatically displayed.





6 Roll SEL/PUSH EXECUTE down to select RETURN, and press SEL/PUSH EXECUTE.

The MENU screen resumes. (The clock starts as soon as you roll SEL/PUSH EXECUTE.)

- 7 If you want to change the settings concerning the clock, go to step 8; otherwise press MENU to return to the normal screen.
- Resume the CLOCK SETUP menu.
  Roll SEL/PUSH EXECUTE up or down to select CLOCK SETUP, and press SEL/PUSH SETUP.



#### **HOURS**

The built-in clock of this adaptor shows the time in 12-hour format, but you can change it to 24-hour format if you wish. In 12-hour format, 12:00AM stands for midnight and 12:00PM for noon.

In the CLOCK SETUP menu, roll SEL/PUSH EXECUTE up or down to select HOURS, and press SEL/PUSII EXECUTE to select the item. Roll SEL/PUSH EXECUTE up or down to select 12HOURS (12-hour format) or 24HOURS (24-hour format), and press SEL/PUSH EXECUTE to decide.



#### **CALENDAR**


In the CLOCK SETUP menu, roll SEL/PUSH EXECUTE up or down to select CALENDAR, and press SEL/PUSH EXECUTE to select the item. Roll SEL/PUSH EXECUTE up or down to select MONTH/DAY/YEAR, DAY/MONTH/YEAR or YEAR/MONTH/DAY, and press SEL/PUSH EXECUTE to decide.

#### **POSITION**

In the CLOCK SETUP menu, roll SEL/PUSH EXECUTE up or down to select POSITION, and press SEL/PUSH EXECUTE to select the item. Roll SEL/PUSH EXECUTE up or down to select the desired clock position, and press SEL/PUSH EXECUTE to decide.




The clock position changes as follows:



#### **DISPLAY**

In the CLOCK SETUP menu, roll SEL/PUSH EXECUTE up or down to select DISPLAY, and press SEL/PUSH EXECUTE to select the item. Roll SEL/PUSH EXECUTE up or down to select ON or OFF, and press SEL/PUSH EXECUTE to decide.

**ON**: The clock is displayed. **OFF**: The clock is not displayed.




#### **ALARM**

In the CLOCK SETUP menu, roll SEL/PUSH EXECUTE up or down to select ALARM, and press SEL/PUSH EXECUTE to select the item. Roll SEL/PUSH EXECUTE up or down to select ON or OFF, and press SEL/PUSH EXECUTE to decide.

ON: The alarm number is displayed in normal mode and while an alarm recording is being made.

**OFF:** The alarm number is not displayed. However, the alarm number is counted and retained in the memory.



9 Roll SEL/PUSH EXECUTE up or down to select RETURN, and press SEL/PUSH EXECUTE.

The MENU screen resumes.

10 Press MENU.

The normal screen resumes.

#### To resume the MENU screen

Press MENU.

#### Notes on the built-in clock

- If the lithium battery is not installed, the clock will be reset each time you turn off this adaptor and turn it on back again.
- The built-in clock may not work correctly due to temperature change and so on. Check the clock occasionally and set it again if necessary.


#### Note on the clock display position

According to the camera or video source, the clock indication may be distorted at the upper part of the screen. In this case, select the lower position for clock display.

# **Optional Setting Up**


You can select the type of status signal (tape end out or recording indication out) using the OPTIONAL SETUP menu. With this menu, you can also specify the type of the audio source equipment connected to this adaptor (line input or microphone).







LINE: When an audio source is connected to the AUDIO L or AUDIO R jack.

MIC: When a microphone is connected to the AUDIO L or AUDIO R jack.

When you do not connect any audio source, select LINE. If you select MIC, noise may be picked up.

# Setting the Program Recording Conditions

# What is the Program Recording?

This adaptor gives you a choice of any one of the following three program recording modes:

#### ALARM mode (see page 28)

When an alarm signal is input to this adaptor, the Video Walkman starts recording automatically for a specified duration with its alarm number and the date and time displayed on the monitor. This adaptor considers an alarm signal input through the ALARM IN/TAPE END OUT/REC IND OUT jack of this adaptor as a trigger for alarm recording. (A power failure is also considered as a trigger.) The time and cause of an alarm signal is stored in the memory of this adaptor with the alarm number so that you can refer to them later on. This is called the alarm mode.

# CONTI REC (Continuous Recording) mode (see page 33)

The Video Walkman keeps recording and the buttons on the Video Walkman are locked. Therefore the recording does not stop even when you press  $\square$  (stop) or  $\blacksquare \blacksquare$  (pause) on the Video Walkman by mistake.

When an alarm signal is input in CONTI REC mode, the date/ time and cause of the alarm signal is memorized in the alarm list. While the alarm signal is input, the alarm number is superimposed and recorded on the tape.

#### TIMER mode (see page 35)


The Video Walkman performs program recording according to the preset timer programs. You can preset up to 6 events over one month to this adaptor. In each event, you can set the date, the starting and ending time, and the program recording mode; ALM (alarm) or CREC (continuous recording). Moreover, you can perform the same program recording on every day or on a specific day of every week.

After completing the settings, be sure to check whether the settings are correct or not by pressing CHECK to see the CHECK screen. (See page 42.)

When the settings are correct, press PGM/LIST REC ON/OFF to enter program recording mode. (See page 40.)







DURATION	To set how long a recording should be made after receiving an alarm signal CC: The Video Walkman keeps recording as long as an alarm signal is input.  TOGGLE: Video Walkman repeats starting/stopping the program recording each time an alarm signal is input.  10S/20S/30S (10/20/30 seconds): The Video Walkman records for about 10, 20 or 30 seconds after an alarm signal is input.  1M/2M/3M/5M/10M/20M/30M (1 to 30 minutes): The Video Walkman records for about 1, 2, 3, 5, 10, 20 or 30 minute(s) after an alarm signal is input.  1H (1 hour): The Video Walkman records for about 1 hour after an alarm signal is input. However,if there is no alarm signal for about 5 minutes, the Video Walkman waits in stop mode.  POWER SAVE: The Video Walkman turns off. When an alarm signal is input or at the starting time of the TIMER setting, the Video Walkman turns on and starts recording.  ALM OFF (alarm off): (only when you select TIMER in REC MODE SETUP) The Video Walkman turns off until the starting time of the TIMER setting comes. Even if an alarm signal is input, the Video Walkman ignores it and the power remains off.
-ON TRIGGER	To decide what is considered as an alarm signal  ON: A power-on signal of this adaptor is considered as an alarm signal.  OFF: A power-on signal of this adaptor is not considered as an alarm signal.  If DURATION is set to CC or TOGGLE and when recording starts by a power on signal, recording will continue for about 20 seconds.
EPEAT	To decide what to do when the tape reaches its end while a program recording is made.  ON: The tape rewinds to the beginning and starts program recording again. Note that this setting erases the previous recordings.  OFF-ALM (off with alarm): The tape stops when an alarm recording is made. When no alarm recording is made, the tape rewinds to the beginning and starts program recording again.  OFF: The tape stops.
